## Understanding the Pyramid Model: A Path to Positive Child Development

The Pyramid Model is a framework of evidence-based practices for promoting young children's healthy social and emotional development. Programs implementing the Pyramid Model have been shown to have lower rates of suspension and expulsion, and lower rates of stress and burnout among educators. Implementing the Pyramid Model helps ensure that Every Child Belongs.

### Effective Workforce

The foundation of the Pyramid Model is a well-trained and supported team. This means having strong systems and policies to ensure that everyone working with young children gets ongoing training, coaching, and support to successfully use Pyramid Model practices.

### Nurturing and Responsive Relationships and High Quality Supportive Environments

This level of the Pyramid Model benefits all children by creating caring relationships and safe, supportive spaces. These are essential for children's social and emotional growth.

### Targeted Social Emotional Supports

This level focuses on using social emotional teaching strategies to prevent problems and to address challenging situations that come up. Examples of targeted social emotional skills include:

- Understanding and expressing emotions
- Solving problems
- Playing and working well with others
- Emotional regulation

### Intensive Intervention

A few children will need individualized supports to address their unique challenges. This process includes collecting data on the child's behavior and working closely with families and other support professionals to create a plan that meets the child's needs and teach replacement skills.

## Targeted Social Emotional Supports

Pyramid Model is most effective when the framework is implemented program-wide. This requires the program to create a leadership team that collects data and guides the program in implementation.
